Valsartan (Losartan and Irbesartan)	All third-party payors that, from at least January 1, 2012 through the date of final recall as of November 10, 2021, paid any amount of money in AK, AZ, CA, CO, CT, DE, FL, HI, ID, IL, KY, LA, ME, MA, MN, MO, NE, NH, NM, NY, NC, ND, OK, OR, PA, SD, TX, VA or WA for a Valsartan-containing drug that was manufactured by any Active Pharmaceutical Ingredient or Finished Dose Manufacturer Defendant and distributed or sold in the United States by any Active Pharmaceutical Ingredient, Finished Dose or Wholesaler Defendant.
Tracleer (Bosentan)	All entities that, for consumption by their members, employees, insureds, participants or beneficiaries, purchased, paid and/or provided reimbursement for some or all of the purchase price of Tracleer or Bosentan, other than for resale, in AZ, CA, FL, IL, IA, ME, MD, MA, MI, MN, MS, MO, MT, NE, NV, NH, NM, NY, NC, ND, OR, RI, SC, SD, UT, VT, VA, WV, WI, District of Columbia and/or Puerto Rico, at any time during the period of December 29, 2015 to the present.
